To the DaySpring Emmaus Community:

There’s a “fresh wind blowing” throughout the DaySpring Emmaus Community can you feel it? Our movement has been richly blessed in 2003 and we give all the glory and honor to our Lord and Savior.

In the early 1990’s, many of the original organizers remember the enthusiasm when over 300 fellow believers gathered together in one of our local churches to form the DaySpring Emmaus Community of Southern Indiana. Sponsorship was at an all time high. We had waiting lists of people wanting to attend one of our seven Walks per year and I might add most of those Walks were always full. We had many Reunion Groups meeting daily, and God was pouring out an abundance of blessings throughout the Community.

Then we turned on the cruise control and started to drift. We began to take for granted the miracles and wonders witnessed on the Walks to Emmaus. Our pilgrim list began to decrease and the Board was forced to cancel 3 Walks. Our monthly Gatherings dwindled to as few as 25 or 30 in attendance and our Reunion Groups shrank in numbers. Many people questioned whether we

had saturated the area, and maybe the Emmaus movement was near an end.

I remember sitting in a Board meeting in September 2002 when the question was asked: “why are we having these Walks and monthly Gatherings?” “Is God being honored and glorified by these shrinking results?” The answer was very obvious, the system needed to be overhauled.

It got me thinking about the question a Pharisee once asked Jesus, “Teacher, which is the greatest commandment?” Jesus replied, “Love the Lord your God with half your heart and with half your mind. (Those that know me— understand that I’m just having some fun with you). We all know God wants it ALL . . . All of our hearts, all of our souls and all of our minds. Can you imagine the impact this army of believers would have throughout Southern Indiana if we gave God everything?”

The Board of Directors began asking, how can God be glorified and honored by these Walks and Gatherings? The answer was very simple, if each of us began serving this Community with all of our hearts, with all of our souls and with all of our minds, God would be glorified and honored. The belief was that God would then pour out his bless-

ings on this Community. And He has!

The last Ladies Walk was full and the men had 40 signed applications. The Candlelight services were as large as any of us could remember attending and we have not had a Gathering this year under 250 people. It was reported last evening that we already had 68 ladies and 45 men signed up for our Fall Walks and this is only August. Oops, I wasn’t supposed to mention that. Maybe we haven’t saturated the area after all. Maybe we’ll have to add another Walk . . . Wouldn’t that be terrible?

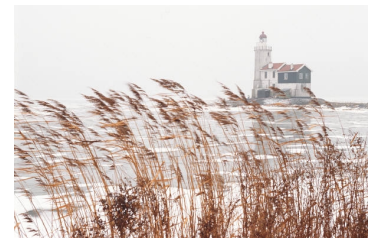
Let me stop here for a moment and say, God doesn’t care if we have 5 people on a Walk or 50 people, he doesn’t count. But let me ask, are you encouraged or discouraged when the Walks are half full? I remember serving on a Walk not too long ago where only 25 men showed up for the Thursday Send-off. We were so discouraged we actually discussed canceling the entire walk. The point is this, when we are weak, God is strong and we had a great weekend. But Satan knows how to discourage our Community therefore I believe if each of us would sponsor just one person, we would be blessed beyond anything we could ever imagine and in the meantime it would be a tremendous encouragement to our entire

Community.

What lies ahead for 2004? Maybe it’s time for each of us to start asking some questions . . . Are we giving God our all? Is God being glorified and honored by our actions in this Community? Am I doing my part to build the kingdom? Have I sponsored someone lately? Have I made some agape to be given to the pilgrims on the Walks? Have I served on a Team, prayed for a Walk, written a letter, attended Candlelight or attended a Closing? Have I served on a REC? (Residents Encounter Christ) Have I sponsored a young adult on a Chrystalis?

Let me tell you, there is a “Fresh Wind Blowing” throughout the DaySpring Emmaus Community. Why not jump on Board and give Him your all? You’ll be blessed when you do, and we’ll give God all the glory, honor and praise!

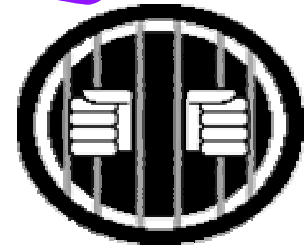
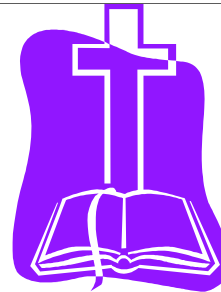

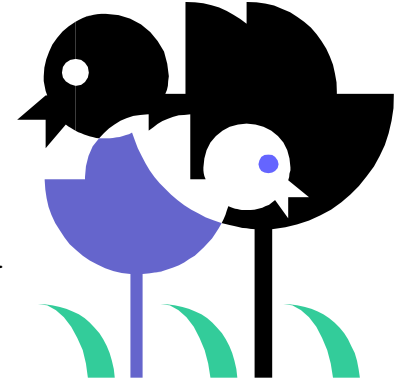

Letter to the DaySpring Emmaus Community from Women's Walk #70 Lay Director Martha Metts

Dear DaySpring Emmaus Community:

When I received the phone call to be Lay Director of Walk #70, I knew what the theme song would be, Michael W. Smith's, "Draw Me Close".

On Saturday morning, April 12, 2003, I was reading the Upper Room Devotional Guide. The devotion for that day was entitled, "Jesus and the Chickens". The scripture that went with the devotion was from Matthew 23:37..... "*Jerusalem, Jerusalem....How often I have longed to gather your children together as a Hen gathers her "chicks" under her wings, but you were not willing*".
