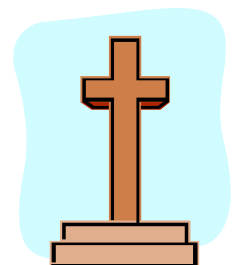

SPONSORSHIP = SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITY

While most church-related functions take a “Y’all come!” approach to participation, Emmaus relies on

Q How does the Walk depend on effective sponsorship?

A Sponsorship is integral to a discerning approach to recruitment, personal agape, letters and prayer for pilgrims, sponsors’ presence at candlelights and closings, and follow-up activities.

Sponsors help to make the Walk an act of sacrificial love from the beginning to end—something much more than the usual retreat or religious education function.

Q What effect does sponsorship have on the entire Emmaus movement?

A The purpose of Emmaus is to develop Christian leaders and renew the church in ministry. If we recruit and sponsor strong church leaders, we will help strengthen our local churches and therefore their ministries.

Q What isn’t sponsorship?

A Our aim as sponsors should not be “to get all our friends to go,” to fill up the weekend’s roster, to fix people’s problems or to reproduce our own religious experience in others.

Rather, our role is to help

bring spiritual revitalization to Christians who will, in turn, bring new life and vision to the work of the church in its congregation, the home, workplace and community. The aim of sponsorship is to build up the body of Christ.

Q What contracts is in sponsorship must we realize?

A Wise sponsorship is prayerful; unwise sponsorship is haphazard and undiscerning.

Wise sponsorship eventually produces a balanced, theologically centered movement of the Holy Spirit, which is integrated into the life of the church and is our call to committed discipleship and unity in Christ.

Unwise sponsorship eventually produces a harvest that is more a burden for the church than a blessing because the movement could become a “religious fringe group.” Such groups may benefit individuals involved but have no impact or relationship with churches in the community. At worst, unwise sponsorship could breed division instead of unity within the body of Christ.

Q What should be the first steps in becoming a sponsor?

A Pray for the person’s openness to God’s call to discipleship, not for how to get him

or her to go on a Walk. Then meet with the person or couple to discuss participation in Emmaus for the sake of a more vital relationship with Christ.

SPONSORSHIP 101: THE BASICS

Sponsorship is one of the greatest privileges we have as members of the Emmaus Community. It is also one of the strongest links in the process that begins with the applications and carries through to the follow-up session after a Walk – and as you continue as an encourager. Some reminders and clarifications will help both prospective sponsors as well as community members in general.

Q What is the first step in becoming a sponsor?

A Once you have prayerfully considered a pilgrim(s) and explained the purpose of the Walk to Emmaus and your role as sponsor, obtain an application from the registrars Jeff and LouAnn Ganote, at jganote@ethixs.com or by going online to www.dayspringemmaus.org and download an application. Be sure to read and fill out all of the application. Spelling the name correctly ensures

Q Who is responsible for mailing the application?

A It is the sponsor’s – not the pilgrim’s – responsibility to mail the application. Once it is received, the registrar sends any correspondence only to the sponsor until the pilgrim’s application is approved and he or she is confirmed to attend a Walk.

Q Who is admitted to a Walk?

A Admission is not preferential to couples over unmarried persons or someone whose spouse has indicated that he or she is not interested in attending. (For application purposes, we will refer to these as “singles.”) On every Walk there is a guaranteed minimum number of single pilgrims admitted – eight if their applications have been processed. Usually there is a surplus of women’s applications on hand. For example, a recent Walk had four male and 28 female single applications three months before the Walk. So, unless more single men’s applications arrive, many women will be placed on a waiting list. If more single men apply, we can better balance the set of Walks with single pilgrims.

Q How are vacancies filled?

A If the Walk is not full one month prior to its date, then singles will fill remaining vacancies on a first come-first served basis according to the date their applications were

Q How should I prepare my pilgrim for that?

A Tell him or her about the possibility of being placed on a waiting list, and ask about his or her availability on future dates, which are published well in advance in this newsletter and calendar. Then note on the application whether your pilgrim is available to be placed automatically on the next Walk if there's not room on the current one.

Q What if my pilgrim has to cancel?

A Be sure to tell your pilgrim to notify you as soon as possible in that event. Sponsors must then call the registrar immediately.

The Walk is not an evangelistic movement to introduce people to Christ. Rather, its purpose is to develop disciples and build church leaders among Christians who are committed to returning to their churches to serve Christ in ever-growing ways.

The Walk originated in Peoria, Ill., in 1977 and now exists in 1000+ communities throughout the world. It grew out of the Catholic Cursillo Movement.

The DaySpring Emmaus Community of Southern Indiana hosted its first set of Walks in 1991.

The R.E.C. (Residents Encounter Christ) is a ministry for people who are in prison. It is an evangelistic movement to bring others to a relationship with Christ.

Team members enter a prison and share alongside the inmates (men and women separately) for the weekend.

The REC counts on Emmaus members' support in prayer, letters and agape.

The Chrysalis is similar to a Walk to Emmaus but for Christians who are sophomores (and age 15) through seniors in high school. The Chrysalis is usually held each January and summer.

In addition, a Young Adult Chrysalis (YAC) for those out of high school and ages 18 to about 25 is held each summer.

Our Cornerstone Chrysalis Community Serves southern Indiana and Kentucky.

STRAIGHT FROM THE PILGRIMS' MOUTH

Pilgrims just stepping off a

Walk are firsthand experts to give us feedback about the sponsorship that sent them on their unique, 72 hour journey. And we heard from several. Their responses to questions about the support and preparation they received outline for us some specific ways we can improve the sponsorship process.

What can you learn about your acts of sponsorship from these responses?

Q What made your sponsor's invitation especially convincing?

A "Watching the change I saw in her own life made me want to know Jesus in the same way."

"He reassured me that the participants would not be Bible scholars' instead, he promised me that they were from all different places in their faith but that we were on the same road to heaven."

"It was nice to know that scholarships were available, because I couldn't afford it at the time."

"I was impressed by how



much more alive and uninhibited to praise God my

Q What do you wish your sponsor would've told you beforehand?

A "To bring some money or my checkbook since I'd have a chance to purchase books during the Walk."

"I wanted to hear a little more about the format. Telling me that lay and clergy give personal talks wouldn't have spoiled any surprises."

"I would've felt secure to know that I'd be part of a small group at my table all weekend."

"I got tired of hearing 'Don't anticipate' so much. It's overkill. It made me wonder what in heaven's name would be happening, and that diverts my focus at first."

"I wish she would have told me not to expect a mountain-top the first evening. I got a slow start!"

"It would have been nice for him to suggest that I pray for my own spiritual readiness during the weeks leading up to my Walk. Now I know to do that on my own!"

Q What did you sponsor do during the Walk that was helpful?

A "He took me to dinner before and after the Walk, prayed for me and fed my cats."

"She came several miles to serve. That made me feel great."

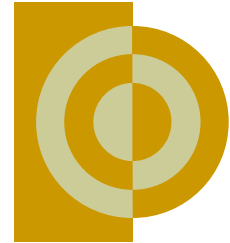

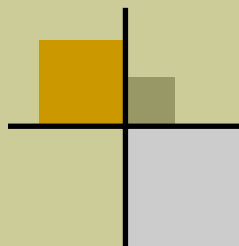

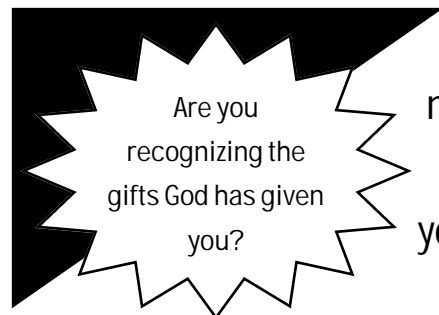
