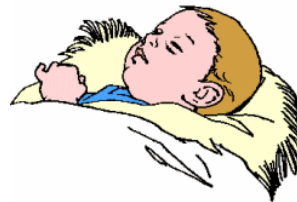

FREED FROM WITHIN

There is no doubt that serving on a Walk weekend and/or a REC weekend is a tremendous experience. For anyone who has yearned to serve Him in a way that could change a person's life, we would like to call your attention to what some of our fellow community members are doing and what you can do to help.

You may have seen the article in the December 22, 2004 issue of The Corydon Democrat entitled "Answered prayer". Just in case you missed it, we wanted bring to your attention the work that is occurring "in His name" by the Freed From Within (FFW) organization.

The FFW group is a group that helps newly released inmates return to society. Since many of them return to "less than ideal" environments, it can be difficult for them to make the necessary lifestyle changes that will enable them to stay out of jail. FFW helps them with these changes by giving them the support, direction, motivation, and job skills that they need to become a responsible part of society.

FFW has had numerous struggles since their beginning three years ago but they remained steadfast in their service; operating on a budget of very little money and constant prayer. In September, their prayers were answered when Bob Metts, a FFW board member, felt led to purchase and donate the former Lincoln Hills Motel in Corydon to FFW. This grand gift will serve numerous former inmates as they make the transition from jail to society. What a blessing the Lord has provided!

The story does not end here; there is a lot of hard work to be done. FFW welcomes your service as they renovate this 50-year old motel into a facility that will house and help heal these persons into our society. Do you have skills to offer? Can you provide materials? Can you paint or clean? Can you offer job training? Our leader, Jesus, has a place for each of us to serve. ...I experienced the Dying Moments Service. I went to the walk with the longing for Him to show me what I need to do to clean up my heart and that service, He did!

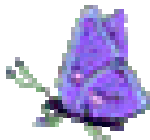
... during the candlelight service.
