## COMMUNITY LAY DIRECTOR'S LETTER

It seems that there are always a lot of challenges for those who attend an Emmaus walk, whether they be team members or pilgrims. The enemy throws a lot of things in the paths of those who are participating in the walks, which I believe is because he is threatened by the way God is glorified through Emmaus. Even though James 1:2-4 tells us, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance" those trials can get the best of us. I ask that you be in prayer, as always, for the walks, for the team members, and the pilgrims, and their families in the upcoming weeks; before, during, and after the walks.

I would like to thank everyone for responding so well to both the sponsor training requirement and the increase in walk fees. Those were both difficult decisions for the board to make, and we all appreciate your support. Training will be ongoing as we move forward, and again, if you have someone to sponsor, even if it is last minute, and you need the sponsor training, we will do what we can to accommodate you. Get in touch with Jamie Hayden, and he will try to work something out.

I want to share a lesson that God taught me recently about facing challenges. A couple of months ago, I was at the Roadshow concert (several Christian bands, featuring Third Day & Skillet) and a couple showed up with their two young sons, one in a wheelchair. I quickly realized that the little boy in the wheelchair had no legs. I watched his father pick him up and bounce him around and jump him up and down to the music. After a little while, the father put him down on the floor. And this child, with no legs, started to dance. He was jumping and spinning; he was doing handstands; he was running (on his hands) and sliding on the floor. He danced with every ounce of energy he had. He was dancing like no one was watching.

I watched a little boy with no legs dancing. And it brought tears to my eyes. Not tears of sadness or pity, but tears of joy and amazement. And, I must admit, a bit of shame and humility as well. This little boy, who I first perceived as having a huge disability, had overcome that disability in a big way. It made me think about how much of what we perceive as disability is in our perception.

The way we see our lives is based on our perspective. How many times has something happened in your life that seemed bad, but turned out to be a good thing? How many times have you thought you had problems, only to see someone else going through a struggle that makes your problems pale in comparison?

God has been teaching me a lot about perspective lately. The last year or so has brought several not so welcome changes in my life. I spent some time feeling sorry for myself, and feeling like I had a lot of problems. But I have seen several people that I know go through struggles of their own, and realized that what I was going through was nothing in comparison. I have watched people give up months, even years, of sobriety and give in to their addictions and lose all they have worked for. I have watched several women that I know bury their husbands. I have watched a good man, one of the best men I have ever known, lose his fight with cancer and through it all, think about everyone BUT himself. What are my problems, in comparison with these?

I watched a little boy with no legs dance. It's all about perception.

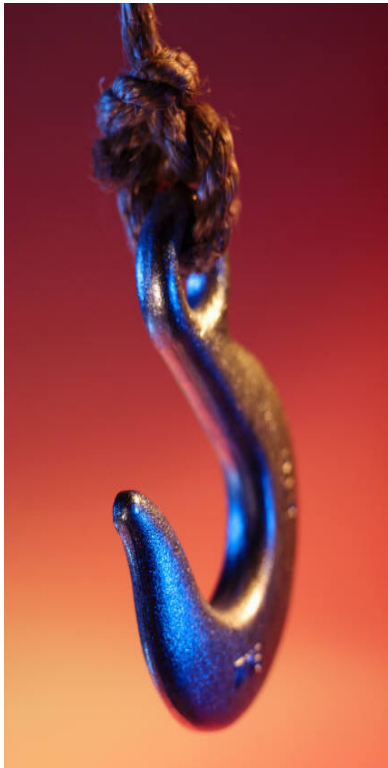

## ***A Huge Thanks...and an Invitation From Power Ministries***

First, a huge thanks to the Dayspring Emmaus Community, from the staff & the board of directors of Power Ministries. Your support for both outreach and benefit events has been more encouraging than I could possibly express in a brief newsletter note.

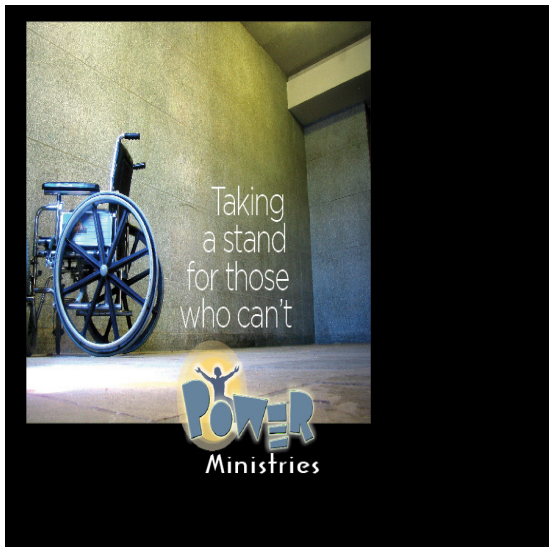
Next, for those who have taken the challenge to join us for one (or more) of our “Handi-Camp” or “HIS Time” events, we encourage you to step up. Since many of you should be thinking, “So...what’s Handi-Camp & HIS Time?” Well, Handi-Camp was the first outreach program for Power Ministries more than 30 years ago. And, many of our campers still

attend one or more of those sessions each year. Power Ministries partners with established Christian Camps, throughout a multi-state area, to do their special needs program. Our Camp Partners are as close as White Mills Christian Camp (near Elizabethtown KY), and Camp Brosend (near Evansville)...and as far away as Camp One Way (near Decatur IL), Lake James Christian Assembly (near Angola IN), and Sylvan Hills Christian Camp (near Bellefonte PA).

We offer two types of Handi-Camp programs; the ½-week sessions, with an option for two in one calendar week, begin at 7:00 PM on the opening evening...closing at 10:30 AM on the final day. With two sessions in a week, session 2 begins at 7:00 PM on that same day, closing at 10:30 AM on the final day. Those “dual sessions” generally run from Sunday evening to Wednesday morning, and from Wednesday to Saturday. Weekend retreats begin on Friday evening at 7:00 PM, closing at 2:30 PM Sunday afternoon.

HIS Time (HIS being an acronym for **He Is Savior**) is a monthly program currently meeting the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of every month in the “Foundry” (youth building at Northside Christian Church), from 7-9:00 PM. Both programs are focused on teens & adults with a broad range of disabilities; some with mild intellectual deficits, requiring little more than basic direction, to those with severe disabilities, requiring total care; many living in alternative residential settings. It is important to note that, although we specify a focus on teens & adults with disabilities. We specify a minimum age of 13 yrs. However, we have made exception for those as young as 8 yrs. of age. And we have welcomed campers in their 90’s.

Activities for both events include worship & praise, Bible study, prayer walks, craft activities, campfire, games, swimming, boating, outdoor pursuits, fishing, horseback riding, horse-drawn carriage rides,





hayrides, movie nights, activities specific to a particular camp...and the all-important "Talent Show" at every one of the Handi-Camps.

Many wonder what people can learn...or what are they able to understand about the message of Christ. To such questions, I must tell you a story about a camper some years ago; a young man whose family came from India, and a Hindu background.

Aseem (name changed for purposes of confidentiality) came to us, diagnosed as Autistic; described by his parents (father, a doctor...mother a teacher) as one who could understand or learn very little due to the impact of autism. Reminding them Handi-Camp is a Christ-based program, they shrugged it off, reminding me that their boy was incapable of understanding much of anything.

At registration, a sometimes chaotic time, Aseem did move away from the crowd, appearing to cower in a corner, exhibiting typical autistic behaviors with his hands. We learned quickly that Aseem enjoyed worship music, and before lunch 1<sup>st</sup> day, he joined the group, participating in nearly all activities as the weekend closed.

On the closing day, as campers were leaving, one of the workers asked Aseem, "What did you learn here at Handi-Camp?" Aseem smiled as he replied, "Jesus loves Aseem...Aseem loves Jesus." -- from the young man who was largely incapable of understanding anything.

Well...the following Monday morning; a caller responded to my, "Good morning...Power Ministries," with, "What did you do to my boy?" Cause for alarm, I replied, "Well...if you'll tell me who your boy is, I can tell that we need to talk." She continued, "No, my boy Aseem...he's changed. I don't know what you do at your camps, but I want to find more of it for him.

Keeping..."the rest of the story" brief, Aseem became an evangelist to his family. I was able to direct his mother to a church, close to their home, where we had helped set up a monthly program years before. In time, the whole family began to attend worship services and, later still, committed their lives to Christ.

A dramatic exception? Not really. I could fill pages about both campers...**and workers**...whose lives have changed through experiences at the outreach programs of Power Ministries. However, since I must keep this brief, I'd like to call your attention to other events.

Many of you have participated in our annual benefit events; the first for 2014 upcoming on May 19...the "18<sup>th</sup> Annual Power Ministries Golf Challenge." It will take place at the Old Capitol Golf Club, with tee time at 10:30 AM. A member of our Board of Directors, Jon Been, is directing this event. If you would be in a position to help with this event, contact us, or Jon, at the "Power House" (812/945-4117).

"Power Ride 2014" (10<sup>th</sup> annual) is scheduled for June 8, with registration at 10:30 AM, kick-stands up at 12:30; starting point & end point: Eastside Christian Church. Prizes & food (following the event) are included in the \$15.00 registration fee (\$5.00 additional for passenger). Joe Cole, also a board member is directing this event.

Our second annual benefit dinner will take place, once again in the Fall; scheduling details not yet confirmed. Julie Barclay, also a board member, will be directing this event.

The success of all our past events were clearly the outcome of Holy Spirit empowerment, through a lot of people...people like you...who stepped up to participate in and serve, support, sponsor and pray on our behalf. We challenge you to join us in any of those roles; right now...as we are recruiting sponsors (both business & personal) for these events. Call us at the Power House (812/945-4117) for more info.
