COMMUNITY LAY DIRECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Emmaus Community:

Let me start by welcoming the pilgrims of Walks 115 and 116. I know that God was at work through the walks and the teams He put together.

I encourage all of you to attend the follow-up meeting on April 27. I also encourage you to get plugged into the community by attending gatherings, joining a reunion group and staying connected to the Emmaus vine, which is firmly connected to the vine of Jesus Christ.

You've all become a part of this community at an exciting time. Over the past year and a half we (the Emmaus board) have been working to add opportunities for us all to stay connected through monthly gatherings.

The gatherings are on the first Friday of every month except for those months when the walks are taking place. They are spread throughout the community at different churches and always begin around 7:30 pm. We have watched a steady climb in attendance take place at these gatherings. It's an opportunity to sing praise, find out how folks in the community were influenced by the walks and also see a lot of familiar faces. Check www.dayspringemmaus.org to find out where the gatherings are each month. The website is also a great place to get documents and find out any current news that might come about between newsletters.

Another exciting thing for the community is that the board recently voted to allow children at the gatherings. Child care will not be offered, but folks who want to bring their children are invited to do so. This is for the gatherings ONLY. Children should not be brought to any walk weekend events, including send-off, candlelight and the closing.

There are a couple of reasons for the walk weekend exclusions and they range from pilgrims seeing the kids and in turn missing their own kids to possibly ruining their kids' future Emmaus experience by including them in the weekend's activities.

Jesus, however, did say let the children come to me and that's what the board is trying to do by allowing kids and young families to be more actively involved by attending the gatherings together.

I ask you to continue to pray for us as board members that God would guide and direct all the decisions we make. We want to make sure everything we do from the color of the table cloths on the walks to the details at the monthly gatherings are put together exactly the way He wants them.

I'll close this letter by sharing a revelation I had recently. By the time you read this letter March Madness will likely be a thing of the past. A new NCAA champion will be crowned and I admittedly hope it is my beloved University of Louisville Cardinals.

As I waited to see where they would play in the tournament on Selection Sunday I remembered a day before computers, iPads and printers where you had to actually write down who was playing whom if you wanted to get a jump on studying the brackets before getting Monday's paper. I would always pay particular attention to the part of the bracket in which Louisville was playing so I could begin to look ahead to the possible future matchups.

As I remembered NCAA tournaments past, I couldn't help but think of the similarities of a basketball team's approach entering the tournament to our approach to our service to the Lord.

Paul said in Philippians 3:13-14, "Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

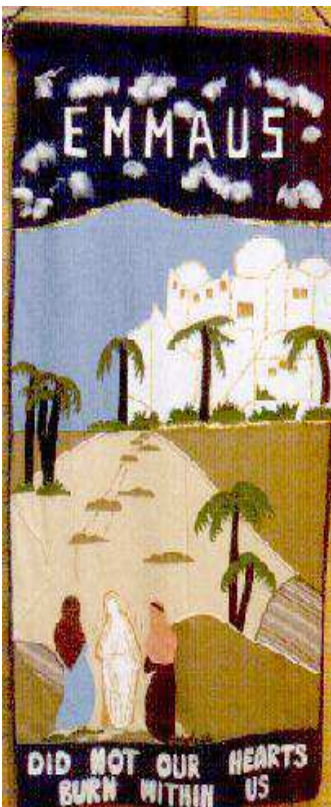
UofL and IU both had sensational regular seasons with wins over North Carolina, Michigan, Kentucky and Syracuse, to name a few. But as the ball is tipped in the NCAA tournament, none of those previous games matter. UofL's three losses in a row in January had zero impact on the games in March. IU losing twice to Wisconsin meant nothing in terms of the "Big Dance."

Like a Christian serving God, those basketball teams had to forget the things that were behind. I can't be effective serving God today if I am too caught up on the things that happened, good or bad, yesterday. Just like Paul said in Philippians there is also a danger of looking too far ahead. A basketball team better not be thinking about the Final Four when a difficult Sweet 16 matchup is looming. Wouldn't it be a shame to miss the opportunity to minister to the co-worker today because I am so focused on the REC I am working in two weeks? In both basketball and life our focus has to be right now.

Paul is urging us in Philippians to focus on the precious present -- forget tomorrow, don't think about the future and focus on today.

That's my prayer for myself and this community; that we spend today and every day focusing on what God wants us to do right now!

We all know how lives have been changed through the DaySpring Emmaus Community. What better investment than to sow financial seed into this ministry?!


